

How to Participate in the Limudei Code-Esh Grant

David Lear Sulman Fund for Computing, Science, and Engineering

The goal of the David Lear Sulman Fund for Computing, Science and Engineering (DL Sulman Fund) is to bring coding, robotics, and computer literacy to as many Jewish Day Schools or Jewish Supplemental Schools (such as an extracurricular Hebrew School) as possible, so it has made using the Limudei Code-Esh (LCE) Curriculum as affordable as possible.

The LCE Curriculum itself is free – anyone can access it either on <u>https://sulmanfund.org</u> or <u>https://sites.tufts.edu/devtech/jewish-curricula-series/</u>. ScratchJr is also free and can be easily downloaded on iPads and Chromebooks. KIBO, the screen-free, hands-on robot, is a unique product from KinderLab Robotics which in partnership with the David Sulman Fund offers a 10% discount on all KIBO bought by schools to use with LCE – and then the DL Sulman Fund is offering an additional 50% grant to participating Jewish schools.

Limudei Code-Esh Grant Process

- 1. Prospective Jewish Day Schools can use the KinderLab website or contact KinderLab directly to learn about KIBO products that support the Limudei Code-Esh (LCE) Curriculum

- School sends a signed copy of the Grant Commitment Letter to the DL Sulman Fund to initiate application. Upon approval, the DL Sulman Fund sends the School a fully executed (signed and counter-signed) Grant Commitment Letter.
- 3. School decides what KIBO equipment they want as part of LCE Grant, and sends list of desired equipment to KinderLab, along with fully executed Grant Approval Letter (required to qualify for 10% discount from KinderLab).
- 4. KinderLab sends quote to School, which includes 10% discount on products.
 - Quote includes free shipping in the continental USA
 - Shipments outside the continental USA require that the School pay shipping costs, taxes, duties or tariffs; shipping etc. are not covered by the Grant or discount
- 5. School reviews quote, agrees to payment terms, and sends Purchase Order (PO) to KinderLab at <u>info@kinderlabrobotics.com</u>.
- 6. KinderLab ships order to School and sends Invoice to School for order price (including 10% LCE discount).
- 7. School pays KinderLab Invoice in-full within 30 days of receiving KIBO Kits (payment via check, credit card, or bank wire-transfer).
- 8. School sends Invoice to DL Sulman Fund to release Grant funds to School totaling 50% of invoiced KIBO purchase price.
- 9. DL Sulman Fund sends grant funds of 50% of qualifying purchases to School within 30 days of receiving KinderLab Invoice from School.
